## **New ladies' softball** team is flourishing

LISKEARD Cricket Club's ladies' softball section played their first softball match of the season against Boconnoc recently. This was their first match in the newly formed East Division of Corn-wall Women's Softball Cricket League.

Spokesperson Lynn Webb said the team played well together and learned a great deal from playing their very first competitive match. They are looking forward to the remainder of the season which will see them take on neighbours St Neot and a return match with Boconnoc.

Liskeard Ladies started training last summer, with most players

completely new to the game of cricket. Lynn commented: "I wasn't playing netball anymore but still wanted to play a team sport – one a little less physically demanding. "I spoke to a few friends in the Liskeard area and eight or nine of us fancied playing cricket, so I spoke to Andy Harwood back in December area and it's grave from there."

Lynn went along to the cricket club AGM shortly afterwards and training commenced in the following May of 2022, with guidance and coaching from Tim Hyslop and help with training from the men's team. Since then, interest has continued to steadily grow for the ladies'

team, with 15 people, ranging in age from 14 to 68, attending weekly softball training.

Sessions are now run by team captain Emma-Jayne Mullis who, along with Lisa Adey, achieved their Level One Coaching Qualification this year

The team have their first sponsor, B & B J Phillips Builders Ltd, who has purchased equipment and team shirts. Liskeard Cricket Club has also developed opportunities for players of

different ages and levels.

Their Dynamos group, for five-to-eight-year-olds, is now in its second year. Dynamos will continue into the summer – sessions are run on a Thursday evening 6-7 pm, followed by the weekly sessions for disability cricket, 7-8 pm, which began this May. It is hoped that links can be made with Liskeard School so that

younger girls have a clear route into softball and then hardball cricket within the Liskeard area.

Lynn is excited about future possibilities, saying: "The club is de-veloping at all levels and there are plans for it to go from strength-tostrength next year.

"We are a really united, inclusive bunch and have a supportive ap-proach to make everyone feel welcome and encouraged, no matter what

## BASKETBALL **City Patriots** sign up Dusha and Johnson

PLYMOUTH City Patriots have added last season's National Basketball League joint Most Valuable Player and finals MVP from last season, Taylor Johnson. The 28-year-old Johnson, originally from Aledo, Texas, has been entertaining fans in the NPL size 2019 whose he signed for the

the NBL since 2018, when he signed for the

Leicester Warriors in D1. He played his college basketball in the States at NCAA D1 level, representing Dartmouth for four years. He averaged just under 12 points per game in his senior year, before heading to per game in h the Midlands.

Johnson has since spent his time in the NBL, leaving the Leicester Warriors for Thames Valley, before spending the last two seasons with Hemel Storm.

He was a massive part of the Storm's unde-feated 2022/23 season, where they managed to go the entire season without a loss, finish-ing as play-off champions and also bagging the finals MVP.

He has the impressive stat of never averaging less than 22 points per game as well as distributing the ball very well, never dropping below six assists per game. Patriots coach Paul James said: "He's been

so impressive in the NBL and he's certainly go-ing to strengthen our squad moving forward. "Taylor has a great all-round game. His

scoring and passing are impressive and I look forward to working with him and seeing just what he is capable of."

James has encountered his newest signing before, scouting him previously for a pre-season game when Johnson played for the Thames Valley Cavaliers, and the Texan impressed coach James even then. Johnson commented: "Tve played at the

Plymouth Pavilions once before, albeit not in Plymouth colours. The atmosphere was awe-some and the appreciation for basketball was clear. I'm excited to be returning, this time in a

Patriots jersey." Johnson's dominance in the NBL for the last five seasons makes him one to watch for the coming season.
